Clean Water State Revolving Fund





- A variety of publicly-owned water quality improvement projects are eligible for low-interest financing including:
 - ✓ Point Source Projects (wastewater treatment and collection facilities)
 - ✓ Nonpoint Source Projects (stormwater management projects, landfill closures, green infrastructure, decentralized wastewater, reduction of atmospheric deposition, land acquisition for water quality)
 - ✓ **National Estuary Projects**(habitat restoration/protection projects in NY/NJ Harbor and Estuary, Long Island Sound, and Peconic Bay Estuaries)


Clean Water State Revolving Fund – North Country



 Over \$366 million in low-cost financial assistance for wastewater and water quality infrastructure in the North Country through Clean Water SRF







Drinking Water State Revolving Fund



Provides subsidized low-interest rate financing and limited grants for construction of eligible water system projects

• Eligible projects include:



- ✓ Treatment Plants
- ✓ Distribution Mains
- ✓ Storage Facilities



Drinking Water State Revolving Fund – North Country



 Over \$312 million in low-cost financial assistance for public and private drinking water infrastructure in the North Country through the Drinking Water SRF





- \$12.5 million in Drinking
 Water SRF funding
- New groundwater drinking source to ensure clean, safe drinking water
- New storage tank, upgrades to existing distribution system
- Bringing water in compliance with health regulations



Annual List Requirements FFY 2015

To be included on the Annual Year CW/DW Project Priority List:

- Approvable Engineering/Technical Report or "Land Acquisition Plan" & Targeted Parcels List for Land Acquisition
- Smart Growth Assessment



Short-Term Application Submission

A Complete SRF Finance Application includes:

- 1) Signed Application Form
- 2) Completion of the State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR)
- 3) Signoff of project by the NYS Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation (SHPO or OPRHP)
- 4) Water/Sewer District Formation (if necessary)
- 5) Adoption of a Bond Resolution
