












## WATER & ENVIRONMENTAL PROGRAM (WEP)







### WEP - LOAN AND GRANT PROGRAM

#### Facilities include:

- Water / Wastewater Treatment Facilities
- Water / Sewer Pipeline
- Pumping Stations
- Water Storage Tanks
- Solid Waste Disposal
- Storm Water Facilities



#### **ELIGIBILITY - WEP**

- An applicant must be:
  - A public body
  - Not-for-profit organization
  - Native American tribe on Federal or State reservations or other Federally recognized tribes
- The community must have a population under **10,000**.
- Projects must serve a rural area
- Other Credit Applicant unable to finance the project from their own resources or through commercial credit at reasonable rates and terms.

#### INTEREST RATES - WEP

- Based on Median Household Income (MHI)
- American Community Survey (ACS)
- 5 year estimate for period 2006-2010
- Three Levels
  - Poverty
  - Intermediate
  - Market

#### **INTEREST RATES - WEP**

### **Poverty Rate**

• The MHI of the service area is below 80% of the Statewide non-metropolitan MHI (\$56,882).

## **Less than \$45,506**

- Project must be necessary to alleviate a health and sanitary problem
- Poverty Rate this quarter 1.75%

#### **INTEREST RATES - WEP**

#### Intermediate Rate

- Does not qualify for Poverty Rate
- Between \$45,506 and \$56,882.
- Intermediate Rate this quarter is 2.25%

#### Market Rate

- Does not qualify for other rates
- Over **\$56,882**.
- Market Rate this quarter is 2.875%
- Rates change every quarter (three months)

#### **LOAN TERMS - WEP**

- Loan repayment shall not exceed the useful life of the facility or 40 years from the date of the note or bond.
- RD only funds long term financing.
- Applicant responsible for short term financing, typically a Bond Anticipation Note (BAN).
- In New York, we use <u>38 years</u> as the project is typically on a BAN for 2 years prior to loan closing.

### **Grants - WEP**

- Grants are determined based on affordability, which is determined by Similar Systems costs.
- Similar Systems are other communities that have similar MHI, population, treatment systems, etc.
- Example
  - Town, MHI \$40,000
  - Affordability = 1.5% MHI or \$600 per EDU per year

#### **Maximum Grants - WEP**

- 75 percent, up to a maximum of \$750,000
  - Qualify for Poverty Rate <u>and</u> the project is necessary to alleviate a health or sanitary problem.
- 45 percent, up to a maximum of \$500,000
  - Qualify for Poverty Rate but the project is <u>not</u> necessary to alleviate a health or sanitary problem.
  - Qualify for Intermediate Rate
- No grant funds for Market Rate (MHI over \$56,882)

## **Maximum Grants - Updates**

- If total RD funding (loan / grant) is over \$4M, applicant could qualify for a maximum grant of \$1M.
- If total RD funding (loan / grant) is over \$5M, applicant could qualify for a maximum grant of \$1.25M.
- If total RD funding (loan / grant) is <u>over \$6M</u>, applicant could qualify for a maximum grant of <u>\$1.5M</u>.
- Grant only Maximum of \$500,000.

## WATER & ENVIRONMENTAL PROGRAM OTHER PROGRAMS NON - CONSTRUCTION

## Preliminary Planning Grants (PPG)

\*To assist in developing RD applications (environmental reports, Preliminary Engineering Report, etc.)

\*MHI of service area has to be below the poverty line or 80% of the State's MHI (\$45,506)

\*Community can not have the resources to pay expenses on their own.

\*This is up to a 75% grant with maximum grant award of \$30,000

## **COMMUNITY FACILITIES (CF)**

#### • Facilities can include:

 City/town/village halls, public vehicles, community centers, museums, food banks, libraries, courthouses, street improvements





## **COMMUNITY FACILITIES (CF)**

- Facilities (continued) can include:
  - Police and fire stations, fire trucks, rescue vehicles, jails, communication centers









## **COMMUNITY FACILITIES (CF)**

- Facilities (continued) can include:
  - Health care clinics, hospitals, nursing homes, rehabilitation centers
  - Schools, child care centers, head start centers, classrooms and dormitories





## **ELIGIBILITY - CF**

- An applicant must be:
  - A public body
  - Not-for-profit organization
  - Native American tribe on Federal or State reservations or other Federally recognized tribes
- The community must have a population under **20,000**.
- Projects must serve a rural area
- Other Credit Applicant unable to finance the project from their own resources or through commercial credit at reasonable rates and terms.

## **DIRECT LOAN AND GRANT (CF)**

- Interest Rate 2.875% (changes quarterly)
- Terms
  - ➤ New Construction 30 Years
  - ➤ Rehabilitation 20 years
  - ➤ Vehicle varies (depends on useful life, up to 15 years)

## **DIRECT LOAN AND GRANT (CF)**

- Grants based on
  - ➤ MHI (must be below \$51,193)
  - ➤ Total Project Cost
  - > Financials
- Current grant caps:
  - Project cost less than \$100,000 **\$20,000** max
  - Project cost between \$100,000 to \$300,000 **\$30,000** max
  - Project cost more than \$300,000 **\$40,000** max
