

Implement General Municipal Law Article 17-A

- Re-Organization Study/Plan
- Expedited Re-Organization Assistance
- Re-Organization Implementation



Non-Competitive

Monthly Deadline

Maximum of \$100,000 per project

- \$50,000 maximum for a study
 - \$25,000 expedited for petitioned local governments
- \$50,000 maximum for implementation

Eligible Expenses

LGEG

Planning

- \$12,500 per municipality
- Maximum of \$100,000
- 50% State Funds/50% Local Fund

Implementation

- \$200,000 per municipality
- Maximum of \$1,000,000
- 90% State Funds/10% Local Fund

Phases of Funding

Phase of Funding	Maximum Amount for a Project is based on the Tax Levy Impact and Implementation Award Calculation Worksheet (not to exceed Project Cost)
1. Project Charter	Upon completion of the Project Charter: 5% of the possible award amount (up to \$50,000) for Project Development (Phase 2)
2. Project Development	Upon completion of Phase 2: Up to 35% of the possible award amount for Small Scale Implementation (Phase 3)
3. Small Scale Implementation	Upon completion of Phase 3: Up to 60% of the possible award amount for Full Scale Implementation (Phase 4)
4. Full Scale Implementation	
Total	100%






