Water Quality Improvement Project Program*	NYS DEC	This grant program reimburses projects that directly address documented water quality impairments or protect a drinking water source. Eligible projects include wastewater treatment improvement, non-agricultural nonpoint source abatement/control, land acquisition for source water protection, salt storage, aquatic connectivity restoration, and MS4s. Wastewater Infrastructure Engineering Planning Grant Program*	NYS DEC/EFC	Grants are available for municipalities to help pay for the initial planning of eligible Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) water quality wastewater projects. Clean Water and Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Loan Programs (CWSRF and DWSRF)	NYS EFC	The CWSRF provides interest-free or low-interest rate financing for wastewater and water quality improvement projects to municipalities throughout New York State. The DWSRF, jointly administered by EFC and the NYS Department of Health, provides a financial incentive for municipally and privately owned public water systems to undertake needed drinking water infrastructure improvements. Water Infrastructure Improvement Act	NYS EFC	The New York State Water Infrastructure Improvement Act of 2017 (WIIA) grant program provides at least \$1 billion in competitive grants to assist municipalities in funding water quality infrastructure. WIIA grants are available for both drinking water and clean water projects that protect or improve water quality and/or protect public health.
