NYS EFC Overview



Who is EFC?

- New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation
- Provides financial assistance including low-cost capital and grants
 - Sewer and wastewater treatment projects through the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF)
 - Drinking water projects through the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF)
 - Various NYS grant programs
- Since 1990, EFC has provided:
 - Over \$31 billion to Clean Water projects
 - Over \$7 billion to Drinking Water projects





Types of Financial Assistance Offered by EFC

- Short-Term Loans
 - Up to 5-year term
 - Funds planning, design and construction
- Long-Term Loans
 - Amortized up to a term of 30 years
- Interest Rate
 - 0% Interest
 - Subsidized
 - Market-Rate
- Grants / Principal Forgiveness








State Revolving Fund (SRF) Programs

How the SRF Program Works


- Annual USEPA grants are used to capitalize SRF programs, along with state matching funds (20%)
- •SRF loans "revolve" as funds are loaned to communities each year, the principal is repaid annually and recycles back into the SRF program to fund new water quality protection projects





SRF Intended Use Plans (IUP)


- IUP is prepared annually to:
 - Describe each SRF program
 - List available funds
 - Identify the use of funds
 - List projects eligible for funding
- Federal Fiscal Year 10/1 9/30
- Two Project Lists:
 - Multi-Year List future needs
 - Annual List ready for funding
- Eligible project costs are based on estimates from documents submitted

- Used to list a project on the Multi Year or Annual List
- List new projects by 6/16/23 to be included on 2024 IUP

Annual List

- Requires an Engineering Report due by 6/16/23
- Projects are scored based on water quality and public health impacts
- Each Annual List has funding lines based on score that change annually based on available funds:
 - <u>Subsidy</u> projects with project scores above this line are eligible for a subsidized interest rate
 - <u>Hardship</u> projects with project scores above this line that meet the Hardship Policy criteria may receive 0% interest
- Should reflect funds needed in the current FFY
- Can submit a SRF Application in the FFY





SRF Application

- Need to be on Annual List
- Same application for both CW and DW projects
- Required Documents
 - SRF Application
 - Bond Resolution
 - Environmental Review
 - SHPO Letter
 - District Formation, if applicable





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Mandatory Terms & Conditions


- Contracts paid for with EFC funds must include EFC Terms & Conditions (T&Cs)
 - Formerly known as Bid Packets
- Contracts that do not include the required contractual language are ineligible for funding
- Typical programmatic requirements include:
 - MWBE/EEO/DBE
 - Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Business (SDVOB)
 - American Iron and Steel (AIS)
 - Davis-Bacon Federal Prevailing Wage
 - A/E Services Procurement*









Grant Programs Available

Grant Programs Available at EFC

- Engineering Planning Grants (EPG)
- Green Innovation Grant Program (GIGP)
- Water Infrastructure Improvement Act (WIIA)
- Intermunicipal Water Infrastructure Grants Program (IMG)



Engineering Planning Grant (EPG) Program

- DEC and EFC offer grants to help municipalities facing economic hardship pay for the initial planning of eligible CWSRF projects
 - Development of an Engineering Report
- Grants Available:
 - Up to \$100,000 per locality for inflow/infiltration studies required by enforcement action
 - Up to \$50,000 per locality all other projects
- Report can be used to be listed for CWSRF funding or grant programs
- State Financial Assistance T&Cs (30% MWBE/6% SDVOB)
- Apply through Consolidated Funding Application (CFA)
- Application is currently closed

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Green Innovation Grant Program (GIGP)

- Eligible project categories include:
 - Water Efficiency:
 - Reuse, Conserve or Improve Water Efficiency
 - 50-75% grants available
 - Energy Efficiency:
 - Reduce Energy Consumption or Produce Renewable Energy
 - 50-75% grants available
 - Green Stormwater Infrastructure:
 - Maintain and restore natural hydrology by infiltration, evapotranspiration, and harvesting stormwater
 - 75-90% grants available
- SRF T&Cs (20% MWBE)
- Apply through Consolidated Funding Application (CFA)
- Application is currently closed





Clean Water Infrastructure Act of 2017 (CWIA)

- Water Infrastructure Improvement Act (WIIA) grant program
- Intermunicipal Water Infrastructure Grant (IMG) program
- Over \$600M awarded in April 2022 and \$225M to be awarded in the current round being evaluated
- Awarded to municipalities
- CWSRF and DWSRF eligible projects
- Must result in construction of the project
- Application is currently closed

WIIA Grant Overview

- Clean Water WIIA
 - Municipalities will be awarded 25% of total net eligible project costs, including phases of the project, up to \$25 million
 - Stormwater scope only eligible if related to sanitary sewer
- Drinking Water WIIA
 - Municipalities will be awarded 60% of total net eligible project costs, including phases of the project, up to \$5 million
 - The maximum a municipality can receive is \$5 million in DWSRF grant and/or WIIA grant per year
 - Projects addressing an emerging contaminant above the State determined Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) may be awarded 60% of total net eligible project costs with no cap

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IMG Grant Overview

- A joint project that serves multiple municipalities
- Available for both drinking water and clean water projects
- Municipalities will be awarded 40% of total net project costs, up to \$30 million
- One municipality must be the "lead municipality" and apply on behalf of all cooperating municipalities
- Project examples:
 - Regional wastewater treatment plant
 - Water system interconnect





Federal Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL)

- Also known as Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act
- \$43.4 Billion in funding over 5 years for SRFs nationally
 - □ \$426.8 Million allocated to NYS in 2022
 - ☐ \$482.3 Million estimated for NYS in 2023
- Allocation is in addition to annual federal SRF appropriations
- List project on 2024 IUP by June 16, 2023

 Projects eligible for BIL funding are identified on the 2023 IUP and upcoming DWSRF Amendments

- CWSRF General 50% grant up to \$25M
- CWSRF Emerging Contaminants 100% grant up to \$25M
- DWSRF General 70% grant up to \$5M
- DWSRF Emerging Contaminants details coming soon
- DWSRF Lead Service Lines details coming soon



- Funding for eligible SRF projects and BIL categories;
- Must qualify for hardship, as defined by EFC's Hardship Policy;
- Must not have closed an EFC financing or incurred SRF-eligible debt for the project before November 15, 2021;
- Must not have issued a Notice to Proceed to construction for the project dated before November 15, 2021;
- Must not have executed a long-term project financing agreement for the project;
- Must not be substantially complete before the beginning of the FFY; and
- Must comply with all applicable federal requirements



Key Priorities & Requirements

- Additional federal programmatic requirements apply
 - Professional (A/E) Service Procurement requirements
 - Build America, Buy America Act (BABA): expands domestic preference procurement requirements
 - Telecom Exclusion
 - Disadvantaged Business Enterprise
 - Single Audit and federal thresholds (\$750,000)
 - Additional coordination for Environmental Review
 - SRF base program conditions such as Davis Bacon, EEO, etc
