## Stay Tuned - New Long-Term Water Infrastructure Investments

New York State is planning a significant, five-year \$3.75 billion investment to help communities upgrade water and sewer systems. This includes \$750 million per year to support clean drinking water, replace aging pipes (including lead service lines), and address emerging contaminants like PFAS.

### Smart Growth Water Grant Program

A new grant program will support water and sewer projects that directly enable new housing and job creation. These grants will help communities build the infrastructure needed for sustainable development while protecting groundwater resources.

### FloodSafe NY Initiative

The State will expand efforts to help communities understand and manage flood risk. FloodSafe NY will align watershed studies, implementation grants, and stream monitoring to identify flood-prone areas and fund practical mitigation solutions. Improvements to the State's stream gauge network will enhance early warning and resiliency planning.

### Strengthening Essential Cybersecurity for Utilities and Resiliency Enhancements (SECURE)

Competitive grants will soon support cybersecurity assessments and system upgrades for drinking water and wastewater utilities. These funds will help systems comply with DOH and DEC requirements to strengthen defenses and ensure reliable water service.

### Habitat Restoration on Public Lands

A new grant opportunity is anticipated for ecosystem restoration projects, including wetland, floodplain, and stream restoration efforts that improve habitat health and community resilience.

*Additional financing through the Pro Housing Community Supply Funds and Lead Infrastructure Forgiveness and Transformation (LIFT) program may become available, supporting water and sewer system upgrades and lead service line inventory and removal.*
