



ACCESS TO HOME FOR MEDICAID MEMBERS

The Program assists with the cost of accessibility modifications to enable people who are Medicaid Members and have a disability, to live safely and comfortably at home.



Access to Home for Medicaid

How do I get Access to Home for Medicaid Members grant funds?

Access to Home funds are available to municipalities & not-for-profits to provide grants to eligible participants. Homeowners or renters in need of accessibility modifications should contact local housing providers and review the list of active administrators here: <https://hcr.ny.gov/grant-partners>

Who Qualifies?

- ✓ Renters or homeowners who are Medicaid Members and have a substantial limitation related to a permanent disability.
- ✓ Assisted residential unit must be the primary, permanent residence of the Medicaid Member with a disability.
- ✓ Total household income cannot be greater than 80% of the area median income or 120% for service-related disabled veterans.
- ✓ There are no age restrictions.

Examples of Accessibility Modifications

Alterations include, but are not limited to:

- Wheelchair ramps or lifts
- Widening of doorways
- Bathroom accessibility modifications
- Non-skid flooring
- Appliances that respond to voice command
- Kitchen modifications that increase accessibility
- Smoke/carbon monoxide/security alarms for people with hearing or visual impairments
- Bedroom/bathroom relocation to the first floor

Guidelines:

Grant awards may cover up to 100% of the total cost of adaptations up to a maximum of \$25,000. The home is subject to use restrictions of a Property Maintenance Declaration (PMD) period of three years.
